

COVID-19 UPDATE | MARCH 20, 2020

FEDERAL TAX FILING DEADLINE EXTENDED TO JULY 15, 2020

On Friday, March 20th, the IRS officially announced that the deadline to file income tax returns due April 15th will be extended to July 15th, 2020, due to the ongoing Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic.

Any individual, trust, estate, partnership, association, company or corporation with a federal income tax return or income tax payment (including self-employment tax) due on April 15th will automatically receive this extension to July 15th. No interest or penalties will be incurred for any tax return or payment postponed under this guidance.

This guidance supersedes the IRS' previous announcement, which stipulated that individual taxpayers could postpone up to \$1 million in tax payments, and corporations could postpone up to \$10 million in tax payments. Under the new guidance, the extended deadline applies to all taxpayers, not just those within the previously stated monetary limits.
